The Special Called Meeting of the Satsuma City Council

The City Council of the City of Satsuma, Alabama, convened in the Special Called Session at City Hall in the said city at 7:00 on the 16th day of March 2010.

Councilmember O’Gwynn gave the invocation.
Satsuma ROTC presented the flags and led the Pledge of Allegiance.

The City Clerk was present. Colton Bradford , a junior at Satsuma High School, was introduced by Mayor Stewart as a Junior Council member.

Mayor Stewart stated that the purpose of the meeting was to recognize the donors for the Satsuma to Haiti Relief project and hear from a special guest Yvonne Trimble, a missionary from Haiti.

Mayor Stewart turned the floor over to Robin Stewart. Mrs. Stewart thanked everyone for their donation. She stated that that she presented the idea of this relief effort to the Mayor and Council after the tragic earthquake that hit Haiti. Mrs. Stewart stated once the

Council agreed to support the effort several events took place in the city. These included a walk-a-mile for a child, bucket drops at local businesses and a collection of needed items and change from school children and local citizens.

Mrs. Stewart then introduced the special guest, Mrs. Yvonne Trimble. Mrs. Trimble thanked everyone for their support and presented a slide show of the damage in Haiti and pictures of the children of Haiti.

Mayor Stewart thanked Mrs. Trimble and then acknowledged the individual contributors:

- 1) Satsuma Fire and Rescue presented a check in the amount \$1547.00
- 2) Robert E. Lee K-2 presented a check in the amount \$1004.60
- 3) Robert E. Lee 3-5 presented a check for \$689.74
- 4) North Mobile Middle School presented a check for \$637.00
- 5) City employees and Mayor /Council raised- \$1000.00
- 6) Ms. Robertson from Satsuma High School stated that after the earthquake her students decided that they wanted to raise funds to build a house. She stated they collected over \$3000 which was used to build one home.

Mayor Stewart congratulated all those involved in this project.

Mayor Stewart then recognized the Key Kids and presented them with city pins and a certificate.

With no other business, Councilmember Monk made a motion to adjourn. Councilmember Black seconded the motion and the meeting adjourned at 8:00 p.m.
